Our biggest asset is our summer staff; we can build all the beautiful buildings and have the best programs and curriculum written, but without dedicated young people to carry on the work of operating a summer camp, we are lost. We are committed to hiring the best possible young people available.

Applications can be downloaded through our website: www.hacamps.org. Four reference forms need to be filled out by former employers, pastors, friends, and a teacher. After all the info is returned to the office, we begin a personal interview with each applicant.

The Results: Great Staff! Even as I reflect back on the summer of 2010, I realize just how good they were and how well they behaved throughout the summer. I didn't have one staff person in my office for some direct consultations!!! They did great!

We have hit the road re-interviewing former staff and begin to recruit new staff, so if you know a young person who would fit well into our culture for 8 weeks, encourage them to apply. It is a paid position, and we feed your kiddo for 2 months; that is worth \$ in your pocket.
