## **Dining Hall Update with Steve**

Fall is football season! That means chilly evenings, exciting wins, disappointing losses, and hot cups of fresh ground Friedrich's coffee. I'm from the Cleveland, Ohio area, but this fall I haven't been too eager to watch my last place Cleveland Browns. However, The Ohio State Buckeyes are doing well! As I watch us build this new dining hall, I can't help but see parallels between our push to complete this building and a football team trying to score in the "Red Zone," the last 20 yards before the end zone.

When I step into the 30,000 square foot dining hall, I am amazed at how far we've come and overwhelmed by how much is left. Sometimes we wonder how we can finish it in time for Earl's retirement in March or how God will provide the rest of the funds we need. The good news is that we are getting closer. We've completed over 3/4 of the building, but the last 1/4 is the most difficult. This



portion takes a lot of time, skilled labor, and money. The last portion includes the heating and cooling systems, trim, doors, serving lines, tables and chairs, as well as lighting, plumbing, electrical, appliances and equipment for the kitchen. When I think about this last 1/4, I can now better imagine how a football team feels when they get down to the red zone, with the pressure they feel to score and finish the job. They say the hardest thing for the offense to do is to score in the red zone. Often it seems like the team simply marches down the field with little opposition until they get toward the red zone.



We are getting close to the "Red Zone" with this building project. We have marched down the field pretty easily over this past year as donations came in at a record pace, people volunteered, and staff were eager and fresh. However, as the months have gone on, the donations have slowed down and the staff have grown anxious and are feeling the pressure. But, we can see the end zone! Earl has handed the ball off to me as the new quarterback at Hidden Acres, and I

want to do everything I can to help us cross the goal line. I want us to help Earl celebrate one last win. This is Earl's last building, a building he has dreamed of for years. With your help and God's provision of money, workers, and endurance, I know we can do this. Help us finish strong. Help us send Earl and DeDe into their retirement with a completed dining hall.
